


Additional changes include:

- Semi-Rural Land use honored through new design including only18 single family detached homes in SRR which eliminates the need for a comprehensive plan amendment.
- Proposed Transportation Impacts: 40% reduction in overall average daily trips.
- Neo-traditional street grid pattern using rear load garage dwelling designs.
- All homes within 5 minute walk of commercial node.
- Greater variety of housing types.
- Revised street design to provide opportunity to preserve trees and silos along main streets (Roads B & C).
- Enhanced streetscape variety through additional hierarchy type within the residential area.

DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM:

Approximately 140,000 gross square feet of commercial building area is programmed throughout the commercial component of Kline. These areas shall develop pedestrian nodes/plazas and encourage connection of non-residential spaces. All pedestrian circulations shall comply with the ADA standards.






Route 28 Corridor Feasibility Study



Alternative 2B was ranked the highest due to being:

- The alternative with the greatest project benefits including:
- Greatest reduction in traffic in Historic Manassas
- Shortest Travel time between Godwin Drive and Route 29 in 2040.
- Greatest travel time savings on Future Business Route 28 in 2040.
- The alternative with the second least environmental impacts.
- The alternative with the least socioeconomic and right-ofway impacts and no required business relocations.
- The alternative with the lowest estimated cost
